Yes, it's true, Cattleya is a new brand. However, as the winemaker, I bring the learning, experience and success of 17 consecutive harvests from my past to this exciting new venture. I am living the dream of making wine that I've had since I was just 14 and growing up in Colombia (a country with no wine culture at that time). Since then, I have passionately sought to make only the best possible wines. Thus, Cattleya is a "new" brand with 17 years of expertise and passionate knowledge put into each wine.

Tasting Notes

The Donum Vineyard Pinot Noir 2012:

Cattleya Pinot Noir, Donum Vineyard, is scarlet-ruby in color shaded with carmine and cherry. The nose starts shyly, refined with violets and raspberry, hinting of fresh forest air. A few minutes in the glass reveals its complexity: raspberries and cranberries with hints of sage, black pepper and flirtations of mint. The subtle aroma of French oak and just a touch of vanilla bean is humbly revealed. The mouth-feel begins focused and linear as it develops with great power and an elegant structure mid-palate. This wine will surprise you from beginning to end, evolving with oxygen integration and temperature changes. Enjoy for at least ten years -- and likely longer.

The Soberanes Vineyard Syrah 2012:

Cattleya Syrah, Soberanes Vineyard, appears as deep purple and dark blackberry. The nose is delicate and fragrant, with floral notes of violets and lavender blending with blackberries, dark cherry and cranberries — with enticing hints of pepper. In the mouth, the tannins are extraordinarily velvety, full of finesse with a richly layered texture. Its acidity holds the middle of the palate, promising a long life to this wine. This is a wine with great finesse and intensity, exuding a rich panoply of aromas and a long finish. Enjoy now and cellar at least 15 years (if you can be that patient).
